The survey was scored on a four-point scale ranging from 'Strongly Agree' to 'Strongly Disagree' with an additional option of 'Don't Know' available. For statistical purposes, each available option was given the following point score:

Strongly Agree: 4
Agree: 3
Disagree: 2
Strongly Disagree: 1
Don't Know: 0

All questions scored between 3 and 4 (between 'Agree' and 'Strongly Agree'). This is a very good survey result. All scores are tabulated on page 17.







Question Three: My child makes good progress at this school.






















