A revised system of control measures is in effect

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone. Frequent and regular hand cleaning should now be regular practice, this should be continued
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

In addition to the four control measures outlined above and to minimise the risk of infection to all persons, the following system of controls has been applied by the school/setting:

At all times

- 1) Minimise contact with individuals who are required to self-isolate by ensuring they do not attend school
- 2) Ensure everyone is advised to clean their hands thoroughly and more often than usual
- 3) Ensure good respiratory hygiene for everyone by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- 4) Maintain cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents
- 5) Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- In specific circumstances
- 6) Promote and engage in asymptomatic testing, where available
- In response to any infection
- 7) Contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice

Due to the high rates of infection in our locality and based on local public health advice the school will continue maintain the systems of control measures from the summer term. These include:

- Staggard start and finish times
- Staggard lunch and play times
- Maintaining class bubbles wherever possible

The school leadership will review the risk assessment weekly and will adjust arrangements/systems in accordance with local advice.
